What is Camp Extreme?

Camp Extreme is a 24-hour outdoor adventure for ages P6 and up. Children can learn new skills, meet personal and team challenges, and have fun. We'll talk about God and his plan for the young people's lives whilst camping under the stars. Each camp is limited to a group of twelve participants.

Barry Train heads up Urban Reach and Camp Extreme. He is an experienced instructor and his team will oversee all aspects of health & safety, and risk assessment throughout the camps. Joining Barry is a range of trained instructors, each with their own skill-set; they will teach any activities we undertake. All volunteers are PVG checked and trained in health and safety.

What will the children learn?

PRACTICAL SKILLS: Safety First, Rescue, Bush Craft, Survival Techniques, Navigation, Team Challenges.

TRANSFERABLE SKILLS: Problem Solving, Working in a team, Communication, Confidence Building, Spiritual Awareness.

We are so excited to welcome your child to our camp!

There are a few things to be aware of as you get ready to join us, so please read this document carefully and feel free to get in touch if you have any questions at all.

Things like waterproof clothes really help in the elements, but please remember that Scotland's weather can be unpredictable! All of the clothing and equipment that your child brings must be appropriate to the environment and the time of year. This is just a guide, and you may not require all the kit. The Camp Extreme leaders will let children know what to take out into the wilderness on arrival and any extra kit can be secured at base camp.

Kit List

Stuff you don't need to bring (it will be provided by Urban Reach)

- Sleeping bag and bivi bag
- Head torch
- Rucksack and waterproof liner
- Sleeping mat
- Metal mess tin, fork, knife and spoon

Stuff to bring if you have it at home, but let us know if you don't and we will provide it

- Hat and gloves
- Waterproofs
- Pair of warm socks
- Thin/active gloves

Please don't bring...!

- Tobacco, drugs, alcohol, or weapons
- Fireworks
- Water balloons
- Inappropriate clothing
- Skateboards, roller skates, roller blades... okay, if it has wheels, don't bring it!
- Your pet hamster

Stuff you might want to think about bringing

- 1 pair of robust walking boots/shoes or similar, preferably with ankle support
- Trousers - outdoor/active (lightweight)
- Base layer, mid layer and outer (light weight)
- Thick fleece or duvet jacket
- Sunglasses (weather dependent)
- Casual clothes (spares, including footwear for once the camp has ended)
- Wash bag & towel (to freshen up after the camp ends)
- Personal medication (to be handed in to the team for safe -keeping)
- Camera/phone (in a waterproof bag)
- A Bible (like, a real one — not your phone, lol)
- A notebook and pen
- Snacks
- Optional spending money (£5)
- ...And a bag full of positive attitude!

Terms and Conditions

Please inform us

In order to ensure that we have volunteer staff and facilities to meet your child's needs, you should inform us of any health, disability, social or behavioural needs which may affect your child while on camp. Please complete the basic health details requested when making your booking. It is particularly helpful to know details of any allergies or special dietary requirements. We may contact you for more information. A more detailed Health Form will be sent before the camp and must be completed and sent to the camp with your child. Young people with special needs are welcome at UR Camp Extreme. Please phone for advice and we will try to find a suitable way to help. If your child's first language is not English, please contact us and let us know.

Behaviour

We reserve the right to send home any child whose behaviour is compromising their own or others' safety, or adversely affecting the enjoyment and well-being of others. In these circumstances, we expect you to collect your child, however, if you are unable to you will be liable for any expenses incurred in returning your child home.
